Also included is information about the online course, plus a list of 50 uses for Inspiration and Kidspiration and a handy scoring rubric for assessing graphic organizers.

One other thing you might want to take a look at is : **GameIt! with Inspiration**, a unique collection of 12 different interactive game templates designed for use with Inspiration. You can use Inspiration for concept mapping and graphic organization, and also to support your curriculum with interactive class activities. Each template was designed in Inspiration and includes all of the necessary design elements. All you need to do is choose the game style you wish to use, and then fill in the blanks with your questions and answers. Within minutes you will have a great class activity in the game style of Family Feud, Jeopardy, Millionaire, Bingo, and much more!

Shrinking Documents

Here's a good idea that is also environmentally sound! Ever finish typing a document and realize one sentence in on the next page all by itself? If you're like me, you hate wasting the paper,

Here's a quick solution! If your Word document is just over one page long, Word can help you change the font size to make your paper just one page long instead, saving

Click on the Print Preview icon on the Standard toolbar (or you can click on File and

You'll find a small icon called Shrink to Fit that looks like this:



One click and Word will automatically resize your font so it all fits on just one page!

Newspaper Clip Generator

Let your students become mini-journalists and make stories that look like newspaper articles by using the newspaper clip generator at <http://www.fodey.com/generators/newspaper/>

This website provides a way for users to take real stories or fake stories and make them look like they are coming from a real newspaper. It's very simple to use,
