SOL Review Alert

Just in time for SOL practice to begin, here is an interactive quiz feature that can be used online. [MyStudiyo.com](http://mystudiyo.com) (<http://mystudiyo.com>) is a website that allows anyone to create professional looking quizzes for your website, wiki, blog, or in our case, even our schoolfusion pages. I first discovered this website last April and forgot about it until I was going through old newsletters earlier this week. I remembered this website being very easy to use and blogged about it last year, as well.

In refreshing my memory about this tool, I took a look at how I had created a sample quiz last year. It only takes about ten minutes to create a quiz. A quiz can be on any subject area and as unique as the person making it. The first step is to choose a format. The format will be the way

questions will be given as well as color option. Then you type in your questions (or copy and paste) and select the correct answers. You can also add in pictures and movies. YouTube and DE Unitedstreaming movies are great for this.

The next step is to copy the html code for your website, wiki, blog, or schoolfusion page. Once you have done this, you can then paste the code into the proper place for each forum. And viola, you have an online quiz!

The entire process does not take long at all, and you can easily add it to anything you have online. Each quiz created is hosted on their site, which means you don't need to save the quiz anywhere; it will be available online whenever you want. You can also email the quiz to others or

simply post it on a web page for your students to take.

To incorporate this on your fusion page, click on edit class description, then select simple editor. This will change the editor to html code. In the window, scroll down until you don't see anymore text. Hit the return key a few times and paste the code from MyStudiyo.com. Then click edit description and your quiz should be available.

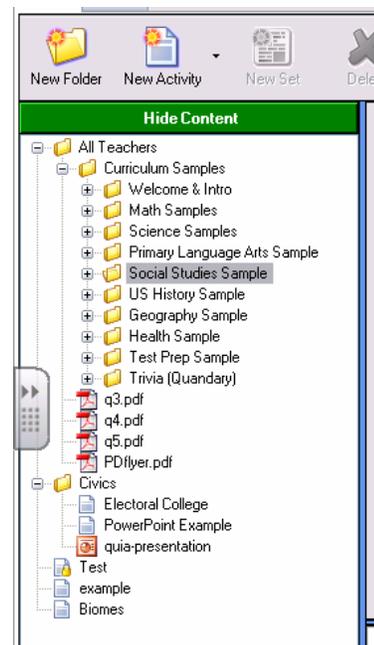
TECHNOLOGY TIPS

Quizdom Curriculum Samples

In early March, Sarah Whitby, a quizdom representative, showed staff members in an after school session how to get the most out of Quizdom.

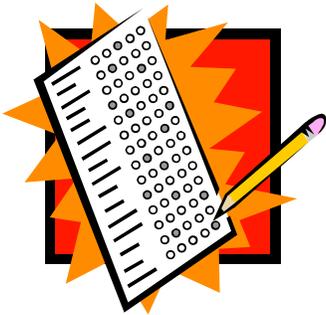
One of the things we learned about was the curriculum samples that comes with every program. When you open Quizdom, on the left side, click on the plus sign beside "All teachers". Underneath that, you will see "Curriculum Samples". There are samples Quizdom activities and lessons already loaded in Quizdom for you.

For example, there is a wealth of samples for Science; sixth grade teachers can find a lesson on planets by looking under intermediate science. While there's not a lot, you can find some things already done for you or grab ideas for another lesson.

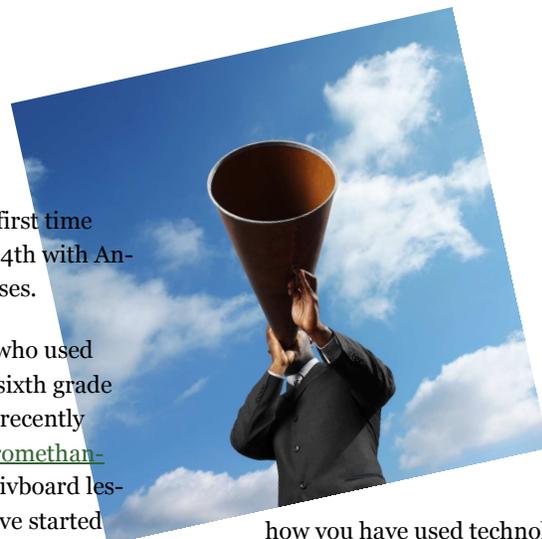
Thank you again for help with the Doodle4Google contest on Friday. What a great contest for kids to get involved in!
