A website provided by the BBC schools program and is aimed at supporting students as they prepare for their National Curriculum Tests in English, Math

While this may be part of the British curriculum and there will be some differences in content, such as the monetary system, these areas can be re-worked to fit our curriculum needs and still be a very helpful site with our students.

This specific link (*click on the title and hold down the ctrl key on your keyboard*) will lead you to the middle school age section of the website. There are several categories included beyond those listed above and within each category you'll find a range of animation movies and fact sheets designed to reinforce a student's grasp of all the key points they need to understand, plus quizzes to assess their knowledge, and finally a number of worksheets suitable for

classroom use. One of the areas I like so well with this website is that there are plenty of exercises that work language arts skills. Students can learn about grammar, writing fiction stories, and persuasive writing.

Technology Tips: Opening Attachments in GroupWise

When receiving attachments in our email provider GroupWise, have you ever not been able to see the whole document or the graphics? It's possible that you are just viewing the document in the preview window of GroupWise. This happens when you click once on the attachment. This can also create some unusual effects when printing the document, as well. To view the entire document and print it, there are two things you can do:

- First, right click on the attachment and select OPEN. The attached document will open in the program it was created in.
- Or you can change your settings in GroupWise which will allow you to double click on the attached document and it will open



Fotoll Review

Fotoll is a website that allows you to create polls and add pictures. Polls can be on any topic and include pictures of your own choosing to help reinforce the question you are asking of those taking the poll. As you can see to the right, the form is very easy to fill out. Simply come up with a question to ask students and pick up to five pictures to go along with the topic they are learning. Students can then go to the website and vote.

Once students have voted for their choice they can then see how many people have voted so far and the percentages for each choice. One of the polls I took a

look at was “Mac vs. PC”, which included pictures of both. Voters could then decide which they like best. Mac won out with 60 percent of the votes. Another poll I saw was, Library Resource You Like the Best. The choices were books, film, computer, and librarian. Computer edged out books by 20 percent.

This could be a great site for Science, Math, and Social Studies, as it would allow students to gather and analyze data. This could also be a great warm-up exercise when your classes are visiting the computer labs.

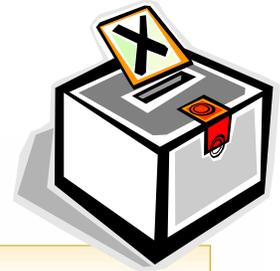
